When I think about the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus, the words of the Angels run through my mind. In Matthew 28:6, they respond to the women who are filled with fear, "He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay." With assurance and hope, the message of the angels is that Jesus is faithful to his promises. He told them that he would rise again. This was his promise and now it is fulfilled. And the invitation of the angels is to come and see for themselves. "Look, here is the spot. And the spot that he occupied is now empty!"

Whenever we face struggles and trials in life, we need to hear this message also. He is not here, just like he said. He promised us that the grave could not hold him and that death is defeated. So whatever our struggles are, with our health, with our relationships, in our battle against sin, in our emotions, or struggles for others, Jesus has overcome. And so the message of the resurrection is a message of hope. Just like Jesus said in John 16:33 "In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."

We have experienced the resurrection. We have celebrated the empty tomb. And my desire for you is that you feel the hope of this season in your life. But the message was not only for the women who came to the tomb early that resurrection morning. It was also for others. Right after the angel said come and see, he said, "Then go quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead," (Matthew 28:7). Having experienced the resurrection, the women were tasked with the message of evangelism. They were instructed to share what they had experienced.

This is the final act of celebrating Easter. No, it isn't egg hunts or family photos in your nice clothes. It is sharing with the world what you have experienced. The tomb is empty and Jesus is alive, and that is a message worth sharing with the world. If we keep that message to ourselves, we have missed the opportunity to share the love that God first shared with us. So, before you put away the Easter decorations and wrap up another holiday, ask yourself, who have I told. And ask God, "who do I need to tell?" Jesus is alive. There is no better news than that. So celebrate the resurrection by sharing the good news. Jesus is alive.

Dear Church Family,

I am so blessed to worship in a church where missions are alive and well. We have so many ministry outreach programs. I pray that God is pleased with all that we do to spread His message of love. The Costa Rica mission team was honored and blessed to have been able to present our trip on Sunday, March 17th. We want to thank you for your prayers and support of this mission. We also want to thank each one of you who covered all of us with prayers during the week we were in Costa Rica. We felt them! That meant so much to each one of us.

As you all learned, we were able to feed and have VBS for over 500 children. What an amazing and awesome blessing to all of us. The feeding program has begun in El Mirador. Plans are now to have a feeding program twice a month there at a cost of about \$300.00. This program is averaging 100 children per event. I appreciate everyone, so much, who have been supporting the Costa Rica feeding program. This past Saturday, Natalia had the program in Pital where they served 60 children. Pictures are attached. One of the pictures shows 4 boys eating lunch from the plates that we took down this year. That touched our hearts. These are reusable plates that will cut down some of our costs. One of the boys is also wearing the bracelets we gave out to all the children who attended VBS.

I thought about what Jesus said in Mark 7:27 and Matthew 15:23 & 24. Mark 7:27 says "First let the children eat all they want," he told her, "for it is not right to take the children's bread and toss it to the dogs." Matthew 15:23,24 says Jesus did not answer a word. So his disciples came to him and urged him, "Send her away, for she keeps crying out after us." He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel." These are from the passage where Jesus is asked by a Canaanite woman to free her daughter from demons. The disciples wanted Jesus to send her away but He tells the woman, he was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. Jesus just set the stage to show salvation is for all people of all nations. I think this is very important to our mission work in all nations.

I get excited talking about the feeding programs but I also know that the camp needs our support as well. All of our ministries are carried out with the help of the camp. They need prayers and support just as the feeding programs do. Please pray about helping with the camp and feeding expenses.

Your team also helped to further the construction of the multi-purpose building at the camp. Through the heat and the rain, the men were able to lay over 1200 concrete blocks. That was a monumental task! Paul Priest, Jerry Russell and Noah Montgomery will be joining us on May 5th in all three services. Paul is our camp director, Jerry is a long-time minister serving in lots of mission activities around the world, and Noah is an intern at the camp. I hope you all can attend that day.

The dates for the 2025 trip are February 10-18, 2025. Please contact me if you have any questions or want to be part of the team.

Again, thanks for your prayers and support for the Costa Rican mission. Without your help, we would not be able to accomplish all that God wants us to do.

### Reading & Response

#### A Discipleship Thought from Pastor John

I can't believe it. I have made it through six books of the Bible in our daily readings in The *Bible Recap!* I was a little worried as I began the book of Numbers. Was I going to make it? With the help of God and those who are reading along with me, I made it. Thank you for your inspirational responses to the daily readings in the *YouVersion Bible* App and your texts, calls, and in-person questions and comments. What a blessing it has been reading the Bible with you!

#### Read James 1:22.

I have incorporated two questions that have become an integral part of my daily Bible reading and even other books that I read. Here are the two questions...

What is the Holy Spirit saying to me?

What I am going to do about it?

The answers to those two questions are not always immediately apparent. There are times where I read in the morning and it is not until late in the day that the answers come alive.

For most of my life reading the Bible was like an event. I would read the passages, check the box, and go on with my day. But over the last 10-12 years that has changed. Daily Bible reading has become an all day (sometimes multiple day process). When we read a seed is planted. When we meditate on what we have read, the seed begins to break through. When we apply what we have read and meditated on the Holy Spirit brings about maturity.

There is a third question that I really do not like to ask. I try to ask it a week after I ask the first two questions. That means you are daily asking questions and contemplating the Scriptures and your life. That third question is this... John, what did you do about the passage of Scripture you read a week ago?

To keep track of all the readings, pondering, and questions, I keep a journal. I simply write down what I read, what the Holy Spirit is telling me, and what I am going to do about it. I leave space on each page so that I can return a week later and answer that third question. Encouragement and accountability.

Transformation happens when we work with the Holy Spirit and God's Word.

Questions of the day:

From your Bible reading, what is the Holy Spirit saying to you?

What are you going to do about it?

Then a week later, what did you do about it? How did you apply the Word of God to your life during the past week?

As many of you remember, last year you fully funded our youth on mission to Memphis, TN, to run Backyard Bible Clubs through a seasoned ministry called Street Reach. Our kids and chaperones were so impacted, they strongly urged us to send a team again this summer. Our spot is reserved, and we're sending youth to Memphis July 7-12. In order to raise money for their room, board, and Street Reach ministry leaders, youth are hosting a Community Trivia Night in the FLC on Wednesday, April 10, at 6:30 pm. The cost is \$100 per table team, and each team can have up to six participants. Whether you have lots of random knowledge that you keep in your back pocket for events such as these, or you've never played trivia in your life, it'll be a fun evening in which anyone can have fun participating. The Wednesday night meal will still occur at 5:45 that evening, but classes are canceled in lieu of the fundraiser. (Nursery will still be provided!) A donation-based bake sale with goods made by our youth will also be available throughout the evening, and our popcorn machine will be sputtering!
